Dear Johnette,

As I prepared this week's clips, I immediately noticed an alarming pattern: we are seeing a growing exodus statewide of top talent in higher education and healthcare. Four stories this week are about administrators voluntarily leaving, and it's not just their current jobs, it's also the state. The dean of the LSU medical school in New Orleans, the chief of finance at the flagship and a former health care administrator for the LSU system have either landed or are the favorite for posts out of state. Just last week the head of LSU Alexandria announced he was also headed elsewhere.

Clearly, those who can swim are starting to jump ship.

The LSU Supervisors erred a few weeks ago when they voted on major changes to the LSU System without telling anyone they planned to do so. The state attorney general has advised they vote again and comply with open meetings laws. The next vote is scheduled for December 7th.

In the meantime, interim LSU President Bill Jenkins is conducting a statewide tour to gather input while selling the One LSU plan. Public meetings in Shreveport will be held Tuesday, Dec. 11. Details are on the SBBA website.

And Committee of One Hundred President Bill Comegys has been asked to serve on the LSU Transition Team. An oil and gas attorney in Shreveport, he is the only representative from Northwest Louisiana.
