## Dear Johnette,

LSUHSC-Shreveport is the only public hospital that will still be funded by the State of Louisiana for the entire upcoming fiscal year. This development appears to give LSUHSC-S more time to iron out details with a private partner. All other public hospitals lose funding in June except for EA Conway in Monroe, which has funding through September.

Higher education, however, has been hit again. The Executive Budget cuts funding another \$200 million for next fiscal year, but the Governor is saying overall spending should remain the same since colleges can make up the difference with tuition increases of up to 10 percent. Jindal's plan appears to work on paper for schools whose students are not price sensitive and who meet their Grad Act goals. By law, schools not meeting goals cannot raise tuition, and according to the Board of Regents, there are 4 to 5 schools around the state at risk of not meeting them.
