U.S. News & World Report announced its annual list of top colleges and universities on Tuesday, and once again, three Louisiana colleges made the list of "Tier One Universities." Tulane topped the list at #54 with LSU coming in at #129 and Louisiana Tech showing at #201. - After weeks of often difficult negotiation, the council divvying up the \$40 million WISE fund agreed on a split among the four college systems. The WISE fund was approved by the legislature last session to address workforce needs. *The Advocate*, 09.09.14
- A meeting is planned in Baton Rouge later this month for public input on a proposed "Health District" for the city. The district would include a four-year medical school. - Xavier President Dr. Norman Francis has announced his plans to retire next summer. Francis is the longestserving university president in the country.
